Who May Attend Powder Horn?

- Any adult registered in the BSA
- Any youth who is at least 14 years of age (or 13 and has completed the eighth grade, if part of a Venturing Crew).

What's required of a PH Participant?

Prior to attending the Powder Horn Course, each Adult Participant MUST:

- Be a registered member of the BSA
- Be trained in their position
- Complete Venturing Youth Protection, Hazardous Weather training, Safety Afloat, Safe Swim Defense, Climb on Safely (courses offered online at myscouting.org)
- Meet the physical requirements contained in the Annual Health & Medical Record physical in a backcountry environment

Prior to attending the Powder Horn Course, each Youth Participant MUST:

- Be 14 years of age (or have joined a Venturing Crew if 13 years of age and completed eighth grade)
- Have completed the unit's version of leadership training (ex. ILSC or ILST)
- Complete Youth Protection, Hazardous Weather training, Safety Afloat, Safe Swim Defense, Climb on Safely (courses offered online at myscouting.org)
- Meet the physical requirements contained in the Annual Health & Medical Record physical in a backcountry environment

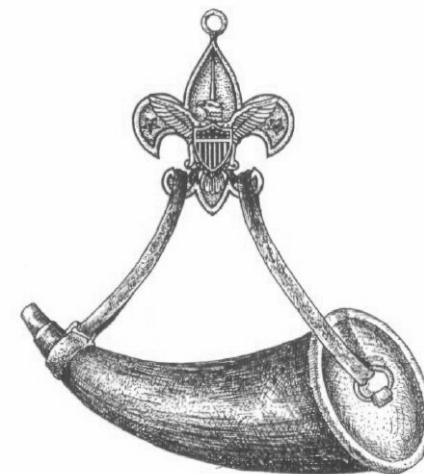
About our Facilities
